



## SRL Summer Reading 2022



Summer is here! Let's take advantage of the extra time and enjoy a great book! Reading can be just as enjoyable as your favorite movie and even it's proven to make you a more successful student!

**Below is a list of requirements for our summer reading program.** Refer to the grade level that your child will be entering in the Fall of 2022 for the summer reading assignments. Please reference your child's independent reading level (IRL) for the other "student choice" books. The IRL can be located by logging into their AR account, where they can obtain their ZPD, or reading level range. **To help select books at your student's ZPD level go to [www.arbookfind.com](http://www.arbookfind.com), click on advanced search and indicate the ZPD range. New families are encouraged to discuss reading levels with their child's current classroom teacher.**

**Entering Grades 1-3: Read AT LEAST five (5) books: (1) book must be the required selection below and (1) should be non-fiction. Complete an activity of your choice using the Book Report Choice Board below for any one of the books you have read.**

Grade 1 Required Book: Wemberly Worried by Kevin Henkes

Grade 2 Required Book: Get Ready for Second Grade, Amber Brown by Paula Danziger

Grade 3 Required Book: Beatrice Zinker, Upside Down Thinker by Shelley Johannes

**Entering Grades 4-5: Read at least two (2) books: (1) book must be the required selection below and the other book may be chosen by the student but according to his/her ZPD (reading level range). Complete an activity of your choice using the Book Report Choice Board below for any one of the books you have read.**

Grade 4 Required Book: Tale of Despereaux by Kate DiCamillo

Grade 5 Required Book: Esperanza Rising by Pam Munoz Ryan

<b>Book Report Choice Board</b>		
Imagine the book is being made into a movie. Create, perform and record a <b>MOVIE TRAILER</b> . Must include a written script.	Make a <b>COLLAGE</b> with a mix of images and text. Must represent knowledge of characters, setting, and plot.	Design a <b>COMIC STRIP</b> illustrating a major scene in the book. Must be neat and colorful.
Write a <b>TEST</b> with at least 25 questions. Must include an Answer Key and a variety of question types.	Make a <b>DIORAMA</b> that depicts a major scene in the book. Must include characters, setting, and plot.	Create a <b>FOOD</b> related to your story. Write up a recipe card to share with your class. Include an explanation of how this food represents your book.
Make a new <b>BOOK JACKET</b> for your book. Look in your local library for design inspiration.	Write a <b>REVIEW</b> of the book. Explain your favorite and least favorite parts of the plot, characters, ending, etc.	Conduct a fictional <b>INTERVIEW</b> with a main character. Ask questions related to the storyline.

**Entering Grades 6-8: Students are required to choose and read one book from any of the options below and be ready to take a test upon their return to school.**
